#### **ARIAD PHARMACEUTICALS Inc. (Cambridge, Mass.)**

The *Boston Globe* called it a “directors revolt.” Four of Ariad’s 9 board members formally stepped down in a December 1 letter to Chief Executive Officer (CEO) **Harvey J. Berger, MD**, that was disclosed in a public filing. The directors who quit, **Sandy Smith, Elizabeth Wyatt, Michael Kishbauch** and **Burton Sobel**, objected, in part, to how a transaction was handled that gave Ariad the remaining 20% of its majority-owned business, Ariad Gene Therapeutics Inc., or AGTI. Dr. Berger told the paper that the directors’ complaints related to the resignations were “much ado about nothing.”

#### **ARMYOFWOMEN.ORG (Los Angeles, Calif.)**

The San Antonio Express-News reported that **Susan Love, MD**, a Professor at the University of California at Los Angeles School of Medicine and a founder of the breast cancer advocacy movement, has so far recruited some 260,000 women as candidates for cancer clinical trials after launching her Web-based “Army of Women” campaign on October 1, 2008. Dr. Love’s goal is to enroll 1 million women, both breast cancer survivors and women who have never had breast cancer.

#### **BIOGEN IDEC Inc. (Cambridge, Mass.)**

In a cost-saving move to the suburbs, the biotech plans to move its headquarters in 2010 from its present location in Cambridge to an office building being built in Weston, Mass. Biogen plans to eventually expand its R&D facilities in Cambridge by converting office space after the move.

#### **CONISUS LLC (Atlanta, Ga.)**

The oncology medical education provider appointed **Richard Leff, MD**, as Chief Medical Officer (CMO). Dr. Leff has more than 20 years of experience as a community clinical oncologist. Most recently, he provided strategic consulting services to oncology biopharmaceutical companies as a founding partner of Small Dog in the Corner Consulting.

#### **ENTREMED Inc. (Rockville, Md.)**

Concurrent with a restructuring and in order to preserve cash, several executive management departures were announced. President and CEO **James S. Burns** will leave the company and resign from the Board of Directors. **Dane Saglio**, Chief Financial Officer; **Kenneth W. Bair, PhD**, Senior Vice President, Research and Development; and **Thomas H. Bliss, Jr.**, Senior Vice President, Corporate and Business Development, will also leave.

#### **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES (Washington, D.C.)**

Former Senate Majority Leader **Tom Daschle**, a South Dakota Democrat, is the Secretary-designate of the Health and Human

Services Department, appointed by President-elect Obama. Daschle will also direct a new White House Office of Health Reform.

FDA Commissioner **Andrew von Eschenbach** will leave the agency on Inaugural Day, January 20, 2009. The administration has not yet announced a replacement for Dr. von Eschenbach, who is a cancer surgeon. Possible candidates rumored for the post include Janet Woodcock, head of the FDA’s drug center, Cleveland Clinic cardiologist Steve Nissen and Joshua Sharfstein, head of Baltimore’s health department.

#### **INTROGEN THERAPEUTICS Inc. (Austin, Tex.)**

A week after longtime CEO and Founder **David Nance** resigned with three other executives and a new CEO was named, the company filed for bankruptcy. **David J. Enloe, Jr.**, formerly Senior Vice President of Operations, succeeded Nance. The company has struggled since the FDA rejected its marketing application in September for Advexin™, its lead gene-based product for head and neck cancer. The company cut two-thirds of its staff and said it would focus on drug manufacturing in late November; it also plans to sell its drug development business.

#### **M.D. ANDERSON CANCER CENTER (Houston, Tex.)**

**Pedro T. Ramirez, MD**, Associate Professor, Department of Gynecologic Oncology, The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center, has been elected as President of the Houston Gynecological and Obstetrical Society. Dr. Ramirez’s one-year term will begin in January 2009.

#### **MULTIPLE MYELOMA RESEARCH CONSORTIUM (Norwalk, Conn.)**

The University of Michigan Cancer Center and **Andrzej Jakubowiak, MD, PhD**, Director of the Multiple Myeloma Program at the University of Michigan, were awarded the 2008 MMRC Center of the Year Award. The award recognizes an MMRC Member Institution and its principal investigator for advancing the field of multiple myeloma research and drug development.

#### **NEOGENIX ONCOLOGY Inc. (Great Neck, N.Y.)**

**Philip M. Arlen, MD**, is the new President and CMO of the privately held cancer diagnostics and therapeutics company. Dr. Arlen was previously Director of the Clinical Research Group, Laboratory of Tumor Immunology and Biology at the National Cancer Institute in Bethesda, Md.

#### **NOVARX Corp. (San Diego, Calif.)**

**Norrie J.W. Russell, PhD**, was named President and Chief Operating Officer. Previously, Dr. Russell was President and CEO of Kalos Therapeutics, a cancer-focused biotechnology company.

## ONYX PHARMACEUTICALS Inc. (Emeryville, Calif.)

Henry J. Fuchs, MD, the company's Executive Vice President and CMO since September 2005 resigned. The company did not cite a reason for Dr. Fuchs' departure.

## PEREGRINE PHARMACEUTICALS Inc. (Tustin, Calif.)

Thomas A. Waltz, MD, Chairman of the Board of Directors, unexpectedly passed away on December 10, 2008.

## PDL BIOPHARMA Inc. (Redwood City, Calif.)

John P. McLaughlin was named as President and CEO following the company's spinoff of its biotech assets as Facet Biotech Corp. PDL's Board also appointed McLaughlin as a special advisor to the company. McLaughlin joined the board in October as a Director.

## SIDNEY KIMMEL COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CENTER (Baltimore, Md.)

William G. Nelson, MD, PhD, was officially installed as the new Director of the Sidney Kimmel Comprehensive Cancer Center at Johns Hopkins on December 5, 2008. Dr. Nelson, who joined the Johns Hopkins faculty in 1992, is known for his work on prostate cancer leading to new diagnostic tests.

## SUPERGEN Inc. (Dublin, Calif.)

David Bearss, PhD, an expert in targeted small-molecule drug development, was promoted to Chief Scientific Officer.

## UPMC CANCER CENTERS (Pittsburgh, Pa.)

Nancy E. Davidson, MD, was named Director of the University of Pittsburgh Cancer Institute at the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC), effective March 1, 2009. She currently serves as Director of the Johns Hopkins Kimmel Cancer Center's Breast Cancer Program and as Professor of Oncology at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore. Dr. Davidson recently served as President of the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO). She replaces the institute's founding director, Ronald Herberman, MD.

James G. Terwilliger was named Executive Director and Vice President of the UPMC Cancer Centers. Terwilliger, a 20-year veteran in the field of health care management, has been with UPMC for the last 6 years.

## VERIDEX LLC (Raritan, N.J.)

Veridex's proprietary technology, used in the CellSearch® System to measure circulating tumor cells (CTCs), was ranked as the top medical innovation for 2009 by the Cleveland Clinic, a leading multispecialty academic medical center. The ranking is based on technologies likely to have a significant impact on healthcare next year. CellSearch® is the first diagnostic test to automate the capture and detection of tumor cells that have detached from solid tumors and entered the patient's blood.

## ZYMOGENETICS Inc. (Seattle, Wash.)

CEO Bruce L.A. Carter, PhD, will retire as of January 2, 2009. Douglas E. Williams, PhD, the company's current President, will take Carter's place as Chief Executive. **NIC**
